Morning glory allowed to strangle

Fireweed, snowberries, dead cedar on south side of Sanctuary

Lamium, invading from Playland above circulation pond, requires removal

Original intent of Sanctuary was a controlled urban wilderness, not a morning glory nightmare. The poor, unacceptable level of maintenance by the PNE in Hastings Park would not be permitted in other city parks. When overgrowth of English ivy threatened to kill natural vegetation in Stanley Park, the City of Vancouver & Park Board promptly and thoroughly dealt with the problem. Community participation through ParkPartners is a solution in Hastings Park.



water quality very poor, with no water circulation. Filthy scum floating on water reported by PNE management to be "not a problem".

Water levels extremely low and

everywhere. Maintenance couldn't be worse. Sweepers and security observed in area.

Garbage at shoreline and in water

Few leaning trees with long standing instability problems left at south end. Most were cut down by PNE after windstorm, which was NOT primary cause of fallen trees. As per usual PNE practice, removed trees have not been replaced.



It is unacceptable that the City of Vancouver, the Park Board, the PNE board and management allow this standard of maintenance in a city

park. Why is Hastings Park treated so differently from other city parks and subjected to such poor care?





Activities

Daniel, PNE tour guide in the Sanctuary, was pleasant but was not well versed in flora or fauna. He had a manual provided by the PNE to which he needed to refer to for the most basic information. Was uninformed about current Hastings Park planning with Marnie McGregor or monthly Nature Walks. Made the unprompted statement:

"there would be no further greening in Hastings Park"

Unimportant if this statement was Daniel's opinion or that of PNE management. He is an employee of the PNE and indirectly the City of Vancouver and is obligated to provide balanced, accurate information ... or perhaps this information is accurate ...

Structures

Earless cow not easily visible through signs.
Replacement of cow's ears still required.
If PNE unable to do repairs,

the City of Vancouver must arrange repairs by capable city worker or artist.





Grass bocce court still not returned to original state from several years ago.

Vegetation

Usual lack luster maintenance evident in this formal, structured garden. Some attractive bedding plants present but horsetail and other weeds in abundance.



Park Activities



I talian Gardens largely left as a barrier between neighbourhood and PNE commercial activity. Ugly fence/barrier erected to keep public out.

Playground site of car painting. Expectation that paint is water soluble and easily cleaned from grass and pavers.



Basketball and skateboard bowl left open to public unlike rest of I talian Garden or Sanctuary

Festival Square used for wide variety of entertainment. Newly installed sod on both sides of water feature looks good and is more user-friendly than original

plantings. Children find it easier to access water.



Momiji Garden



Closed to the public for private event on August 28th

Structure

"VIP" area with tents, gas heaters, A/V equipment and stage in pond. Garden is pretty much hidden behind other Fair activities so that general public is not encouraged to visit





Morning glory present, not as invasive as in Sanctuary.
Better level of maintenance than in other greened areas of park.
