

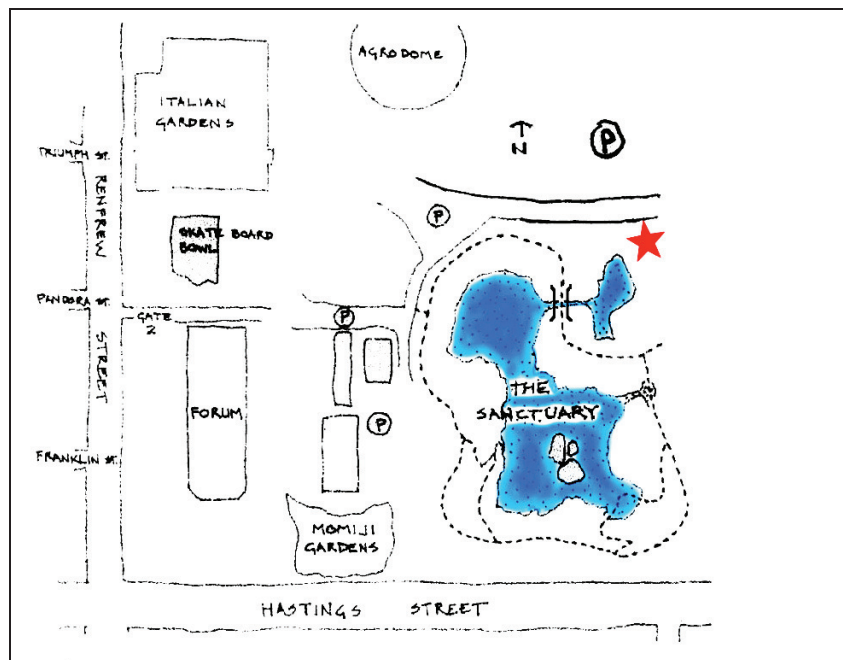
About the Hastings Park Conservancy

We are a committed group of people working entirely on a volunteer basis to ensure the establishment of a 'feature' park in East Vancouver similar to those located on the west side of the city. The original Hastings Park Restoration Plan, started in 1997, included 111 acres (45 ha.) dedicated to green parkland and sports facilities. We will continue to lobby for the greening of Hastings Park on the behalf of all residents of Vancouver.

- be considerate of habitat - please do not damage or remove plants, and stay on designated trails
- pets can harm wildlife and hinder viewing opportunities - please control pets
